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### **RESOLUTION NR. 04 - 2008**

#### **INCLUSION OF THE STATE COUNSEL, DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE (DOJ) TO THE SUB-COMMITTEE ON INTERNATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT COOPERATION (SCILEC)**

**WHEREAS**, the Sub-Committee on International Law Enforcement Cooperation is one the functional Sub-Committee of the National Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee (NALECC) created pursuant to Presidential Memorandum Circular No. 92 dated 15 February 1993 to monitor Interpol Manila's activities and to resolve any conflict that may arise with any government agency in providing international police cooperation services through the Interpol organization;

**WHEREAS**, the Sub-Committee on International Law Enforcement Cooperation (SCILEC) presently consists of the following agencies;

**WHEREAS**, during the 19<sup>th</sup> July 2007 Sub-Committee meeting held at Philippine Center on Transnational Crime in Camp Crame, Quezon City, the representative of the Philippine Center on Transnational Crime recommended the inclusion of the

Department of Justice as member of the Sub-Committee on International Law Enforcement Cooperation (SCILEC);

**WHEREAS**, according to the PCTC representative, the Department of Justice's inclusion to the Sub-Committee as its member has become highly necessary due to the various legal issues encountered by Interpol Red Notices, which is an instrument recognized by some Interpol member countries as a valid request for a provisional arrest, and the consequent initiation of extradition proceedings upon arrest of the subject fugitive;

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Finance representative recommended the inclusion of the Office of the State Counsel of the Department of Justice to be the particular Office under the Department of Justice to represent the said Department.

**WHEREAS**, during the 26 September 2007 at the Philippine Center on Transnational Crime, Camp Crame, Quezon City, the Sub-Committee on International Law Enforcement Cooperation (SCILEC) member agencies unanimously approved SCILEC Resolution No. 003-2007 recommending to the NALECC the inclusion of the Office of the State Counsel, Department of Justice (OSG-DOJ) to the membership of Sub-Committee on International Law Enforcement Cooperation (SCILEC).

**WHEREAS**, there is to strengthen coordination and dynamic partnership of member-agencies due to the various legal issues encountered by Interpol Red Notices.

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved as it is hereby resolved that the **Office of the State Counsel, Department of Justice (OSC-DOJ)** be included as member of the Sub-Committee on International Law Enforcement Cooperation.
